# The Power of Powerlessness

This Sunday's readings focus on 'power': We could ask ourselves the questions: what is power? why do people seek it? and for what gain? Sadly, as the letter from James so succinctly describes, the struggle for power often causes disharmony, jealousy, infighting and division. Many of us will have experienced this in our work places, families or communities. The root cause is often tied up with feelings of inadequacy, incompetence, low self esteem. What may appear to be powerful from the outside is often powerless.

Jesus was aware that as He was walking with His disciples through Galilee they were competing amongst each other as to who was the greatest. To seek power is to focus on the 'l' the middle letter of sin. In one of the first scriptural accounts in salvation history our father Adam falls into that trap. The serpent tempts him with the words 'if you eat of the tree of knowledge which God has forbidden you will become greater than God Himself'. Adam was striving for power. Every time we focus on ourselves it is likely that we are putting down another.

There are numerous examples of reverse power, in other words humility, which are there to guide us. Our Holy Father is called the servant of the servants of God; and Pope Francis did not refer to himself when he was appointed one as the chosen one or anything special, he simply said and recognised that he was a sinner. The Benedictines in their rule or life do not have a hierarchy of experience or rank. The most senior in the community is the monk or brother who joined first. If a Bishop or academic or a dignitary applied to join the monastery they would take their place according to the day that they entered. The seventh chapter of the rule of St Benedict instructs us how to reach the greatest height of humility 'we must erect the ladder which appeared to Jacob in his dream by means of which angels were shown to him ascending and descending ...we descend by pride and ascend by humility. The erected ladder is our life in this present world, which if the heart is humble, is by the Lord lifted up to Heaven. The body and soul are the two sides of the ladder and into these sides the divine calling has inserted various degrees of humiliate discipline which we must mount'. Wise counsel.

Ronald Rolheiser describes different types of power: military power, muscle power, psychological power. He asks us to imagine four persons in a room: a powerful dictator (brutal power), a gifted athlete (physical prowess), a rock star (soulful energy), a newborn baby laying in a crib (powerless power). And yet, it is the baby that will touch us, and transform a room and hearts by his or her helplessness and dependence.

Jesus was that helpless baby who died powerless hanging on a cross who has manifested power that has changed and is continuing to change millions of hearts and lives.

As Jesus was trying to teach His disciples a lesson in humility He took a child in His arms and said 'Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in My name welcomes Me'.

I have just returned from a week's holiday with my family: four generations with ages ranging from 7 months to 90 years of age. Every family member had stories to tell, achievements to share but the person who was the main focus of the week was 7 month old Tabitha who captured hearts and overpowered us by her dependence, innocence and vulnerability.

We have so much to learn in our complex lives and world where we strive to achieve and be noticed. 'Everyone that exalts himself shall be humbled and everyone who humbled himself will be exalted!' (Luke 14:11).

My hobbies include: gyming, jogging, running, singing, cooking, movies, meditation, long walks, travelling, reading, and writing, arts, making friends and critical thinking. I am here to serve you all. It is a delight to work

under the learned and wise Mgr Canon Vincent Harvey; he is a rare jewel in our diocese and my boss. I am here to work under him, for him and with him. I look forward to meeting you all as time goes on. Pray for me that my ministry among you will be faithful and fruitful.
