A STORM OF INDIFFERENCE

I find it impossible to read this Sunday's Gospel and not have arrive at the forefront of my mind that sublimely magnificent stained glass window in St Joseph's. It is quite wonderful the way the window captures Jesus calming the waves from the storm tossed boat. Yet the sentence that captivated my thoughts when reading the scripture was, "but He was in the stern, His head on the cushion, asleep."

And there Jesus remained, seemingly unmoved and unperturbed by the uproar that surrounded Him. Jesus, of course, had not deserted the disciples through sleep, He was acutely aware of what was going on all the time. He was not indifferent but confident, certain of their safety.

Jewish biblical tradition makes clear that violent forces of nature are all symbols of evil, of Satan and his powers, all hostile to God. Only God, Creator of all that is, has the power to control them. And yet here is a Man who can command obedience from inanimate nature. Who is He? Can this Man be God? Jesus acts, the winds dropped and the sea calmed at His command.

Today we are prompted to remind ourselves that in times of trouble and despair, it is not God who is asleep, but we who may be asleep to Him. Throughout our lives, we experience wonderful moments of peace, joy and harmony; but we will also meet our own kinds of chaos, physical ailments, mental anxiety and all the many causes of fear and uncertainty. It is striking how easily a "calm sea" can change into a "raging storm" of doubt, fear and apparent helplessness. We need to know how we, like the disciples, can call upon Jesus and suddenly find that our stormy sea becomes calm and serene.

- 1. Because of the coronavirus, Pope Francis gave his extraordinary blessing "urbi et orbi" (to the city and the world) in an empty St. Peter's Square at the Vatican, March 27, 2020. He said: "Like the disciples in the Gospel we were caught off guard by an unexpected, turbulent storm. We have realized that we are on the same boat, all of us fragile and disoriented, but at the same time important and needed, all of us called to row together, each of us in need of comforting the other. On this boat ... are all of us. A few words from Father Vincent

Thank you again to Father Nick for helping out again this weekend.

As mentioned last week please see elsewhere about our First Holy Communion Masses. This impacts on me with extra Masses over the weekend (so be patient with me!); it also means no 'usual' Saturday Mass nor Confessions on the 26th June, 3rd July and 24th July. These Saturday morning Masses will be for First Holy Communion children and families only: we cannot have anyone else attending. Sorry but needs must.

Thank you to those people who have come forward and willing to monitor/operate the Streaming in both churches. We need many, many more so please do come forward (Role: boot up; go live; operate the camera shots [using an 8 button key fob]; switch off and reschedule the Mass for a week's time!!).

The Government announcement on the 14th June was not what we wanted but what was expected. It is positive for Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals but not for our normal day to day or Sunday Masses. We are still looking for Altar Servers (probably only 2 at each Mass); the possibility of opening up for a couple of hours most weekdays (with Adoration if we have volunteer adorers: Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday; we have a good number for Tuesday so may, may commence on the 6th July as the week before, the 29th, is a Holy Day). Refreshments after Mass are still a 'no no' I think we are all keen/'desperate' to spend time together socially.

We are still moving into a better place (I have been out to the Cinema and a drink!); but still think of others, and remember: if you suspect you have been near someone with coronavirus, or are not feeling well yourself, stay at home and certainly DO NOT mix with others; also refrain from coming to church. I am now doing a 'Lateral Flow Test' twice a week. Are you? Keep safe! Be safe! Thank you for reading this Vincent H
