#### WHY DO WE LOVE OTHERS?

Writing in the online magazine supplement, Psychology Today, Berit Brogaard explores reasons why people fall in love. Quoting from several studies, some of the reasons that Brogaard says people fall in love is because they hold similar beliefs or personality traits, they hold desirable characteristics such as physical appearance or again personality traits, and reciprocal liking (when a person is attracted or likes you, that increases your own liking of them). In his book, 'The Mystery of Predestination' (p.8), John Salza explaining St Thomas Aquinas on the concept of predilection (the special graces that God disposes on the elect to bring about good in them and others), says, "We choose to love because of the goodness we see in others. However, God chooses who to love because of the goodness His love creates in others." In other words, God's love is dependent not on how good we are or the attractive traits He sees in us as Brogaard describes, but He loves us to bring about the good in us. The more we acknowledge and receive this love, the more His goodness will shine in and through us. In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus says, "the Kingdom of God is near at hand. Repent and believe the Good News" (Mark 1:15.) When Jesus says these words, He does not say this to condemn and instil fear in us. His words, help us discover whatever is preventing the goodness of God continuing to grow in us, so that it may be removed and we can continue to flourish. In the book of Ezekiel, God says, "Have I any pleasure in the death of the wicked, says the Lord God, and not rather that they should turn from their ways and live?" (18:23.) God wants us to repent, so that we may find new life and freedom from sin, and reflect His goodness.

In the Gospel of Matthew, speaking on the top of the mountainside, Jesus says, "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbour and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; for He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous. For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same?" (5:43—46). I'm sure that for all us, we probably know at least one person who we at times find difficult to love or even tolerate. It may be due to annoying habit, it may be due to cultural or even generational differences, and perhaps the most dividing factor in recent times, political differences. Regardless of the differences we share, God still calls us to love each other. Following John Salza's reflection, God wants us to love others, even when we disagree, to bring about good in them, and perhaps they will bring about good in us. If we separate ourselves from those who disagree with us, we may only see the differences we associate with them, rather than seeing them as a whole person who has much more to offer; such as their personality, a person who is family member or a friend, a person who has different hobbies and interests etc., and most importantly, a person who is created in the image and likeness of God. It is this characteristic that is most important and defines us all. By choosing to engage with others, they will hopefully see these characteristics in us too. Despite all I have said, the words come to mind, "easier said than done." Prayer, patience with self and other, and perseverance are key.

Of course, it may not always be prudent to engage with others when irreparable damage has occurred such as abusive relationships. Here, because of the trauma or the risk of problems re-occurring, this may not be wise. But maybe when we have had the opportunity to process these painful memories, maybe when healing occurs, we could follow Jesus words given on the mountainside and ask him to give us the grace to pray for those who have hurt us, that He may bring about good in them too.

The Mayor of Southampton, Councillor Sue Blatchford, will open the evening, together with the University of Southampton Vice-President for Education Prof. Alex Neil, the Pro Vice-Chancellor of Solent University Nona McDuff OBE, and Dr. Claire Le Foll, Director of the Parkes Institute. The evening will feature a testimony by holocaust survivor Henry Schachter OBE, followed by a questions and answers session, and a performance by students from Solent University of scenes from the play Kindertransport by Diane Samuels.
