# PATHS TO A BETTER FUTURE

This weekend, as is customary, it will not be possible to gather in procession, to wave palms, or to sing—but it gives us an opportunity to rediscover at a deeper level the heart of Palm Sunday. Jesus has returned from Bethany and descended the Mount of Olives. He now journeys of His own free will to Jerusalem. He comes without pomp or ostentation. As the psalmist says 'He will be meek and humble and He will make His entry in simplicity'.

We cannot raise palms or shed garments to line His path but instead we can spiritually prostrate ourselves in all humility by trying to live as He would wish. Palms will wither and garments will not last. Each one of us has been clothed in grace by nature of our Baptism and we can present ourselves to line His path as rewards of His victory over death and recognise that 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, Blessed is the King of Israel'.

This week we have reflected and paused as we have marked the first anniversary of our national lockdown. A remarkable and unprecedented year but one from which many lessons are to be learned.

Pope Francis in his book 'Let us Dream' (2020. Pope Francis. Let us Dream. Simon and Schuster UK LTD) reminds us of the lessons to be learnt from the Pandemic. 'Such calamities for a time throw us off balance, yet paradoxically they can allow a people to recover its memory and therefore its capacity for action and hope. Calamities unmask our shared vulnerability and expose those false superfluous securities around which we have organised our plans, routines and priorities. They reveal our neglect of what nourishes and strengthens. We learn that in our restlessness and frustration in our fascination with new things, in craving, in manic busyness we fail to pay attention to the suffering around us. In their response to that suffering is measured the authentic character of our peoples. ... We must not let the current clarifying moment pass us by. Let it not be said in years to come that in response to the coronavirus crisis we failed to act to restore the dignity of our peoples, to recover our memories and our roots'.

Palm Sunday and Holy Week are not merely annual celebrations that we sign up for and then move on. They mark the unprecedented and remarkable truth that Jesus Christ gave His own life for us in order that we might be saved. We are called to live that passion and death daily. Death to our selfish and consumer led mentalities, death to our busyness and indifference, and an openness to change.

Pope Francis inspires us to change through our experiencing of the pandemic. Our Holy Week celebrations afford a similar opportunity—to reappraise community, to reappraise belonging, to listen to the cries of those who are still struggling and suffering, to observe and listen rather than go through the motions.

#### (This week we also have the opportunity to remember our roots at the Seder meal and on the reflections of the Jewish Roots of Holy Week).

Branches of palm, olive or budding willow are symbols of victory and hope and new life. After the flood, after the storm, beyond the virus, through the passion, we pray that we will all discover and become life in all its fulness. Tina Quinn

- 1. In today's Passion Gospel, the woman "wastes" expensive perfumed oil on Jesus. Does this relate to God's self-wasting love on humankind? How is the Eucharist a continuation of Christ's self-giving love for us? Does your busy schedule allow time to "waste" on love?
- 2. The disciples 'fall asleep': do we sometimes "fall asleep" when something might take too much time or be too difficult? Does God fall asleep in our moment of need?
- 3. In today's opening gospel, some people wave palms and shout "Hosanna". Did they expect the Messiah to have power and to dominate?
