THE SIMPLICITY OF GOD IN A COMPLEX DOCTRINE

G.K. Chesterton can always be relied upon for a solid, interesting and accessible read. A sentence of his that has been quoted often comes from his book on St Thomas Aquinas, and I find it helpful on The Most Holy Trinity Sunday. Chesterton wrote; 'a lady I knew picked up a book of selections from St. Thomas, with a commentary; and began hopefully to read a section with the innocent heading, The Simplicity of God. She then laid the book down with a sigh and said: "Well, if that's His simplicity, I wonder what His complexity is like."

I lack the wit and the space here to explore the doctrine of divine simplicity beyond acknowledging that it points to the utter unity of God, who draws us together into the harmony of His being. God is without parts and is a love which is completely one. The doctrine of the Trinity does not undermine the simplicity of God, because there's nothing more simple nor stronger than people united in love. The unity of God is a perfect communion of people, where love has no beginning nor end and is a presence persisting across all time.

Today Matthew presents us with the risen Christ instructing us and commissioning us. This is not an invitation where Jesus says "would you mind" but He says "Go, therefore" and make all people followers of His. We are directed to go and take the good news to all. How might we do that? Well, sharing the complexities and intricacies of the Holy Trinity doctrine may not always be the easiest starting point. Telling people that God loves them is a profound truth, but may not in itself convince. Seeing is believing after all.

We have to lead lives that convey the worthiness of our faith. We have to show others to stand up for justice, to cry out on behalf of the dispossessed whoever they are and wherever they are, to give succour to the weak, to feed and clothe the hungry, to comfort those in distress. Then we might find that people come to us asking for baptism.

I hope you have a good 'extended' weekend and enjoy the Bank Holiday. With a bit of luck the weather will be better also!

As you know from last week's Newsletter Supplement, Father Ansel is away for much needed rest to try to recuperate and regain his strength. We are not sure how long but it will be a substantial amount of time. Pray for him. To get away from work he will not be accessing/ replying to emails. Pray also for his father who underwent heart surgery last weekend.

As lockdown eases it is good to see more people coming along to Mass in the week and the weekends. But! There is a caveat! Please do book via Eventbrite. It might be laborious but the other day more than half of those at Mass had not booked! Thankfully the booked numbers were low, but in the end there were 35 at Mass! Lovely to see, but I fear disappointment if you do not book. Also if you do book please turn up! Most weekends now there are 6-10 people who book and then don't turn up. This is unfair to others and also puts pressure on the Stewards: do they admit those who have not booked and take a risk! Please be responsible!

With lockdown easing we may be able to increase the numbers at Mass; but we will not know this until the 21st June, or close to. So be patient. We take advice and monitor Government and Bishops' Conference advice.

We are moving into a better place, but still think of others, and remember: if you suspect you have been near someone with coronavirus, or are not feeling well yourself, stay at home and certainly DO NOT mix with others; also refrain from coming to church. I am now doing a 'Lateral Flow Test' twice a week. Are you? Keep safe! Be safe!
