THE CLARITY THAT CAN ONLY COME FROM A NEW DAWN

If we did not realise otherwise, we might expect the Gospel on this Sunday to open to great fanfare and bombast, for has the Saviour of the world not arisen from the dead? But what we read is Mary the Magdalene shocked to discover in the semi-darkness that the tomb has been disturbed. She fears the men of brutality have taken the body and shares her fear with the disciples. Contrary to our expectations John the Evangelist opens his account of the resurrection with an image of dismay. The Magdalene is joined by the disciples, who join with her in dismay. But gradually in the growing light of dawn, as funerary cloths are seen neatly folded, it becomes clear to them, it dawns on them, they see and they believe. Well, still gradually.

The beloved disciple has understood, but the Magdalene still weeps bitterly. Still she thinks that the body has been stolen, and says so to the man she takes for the gardener. Yet that man is the Risen Christ. And then she too is overtaken by joy, caught up in the good news. Now she must again act as a messenger to the other disciples. But even when these disciples have been told and when Jesus has appeared in their midst this gradual recovery of hope through faith is incomplete. There is yet another journey we must embark upon.

To celebrate Easter, we must look at our life from the perspective of the empty tomb, a perspective which renews that life, which Paul tells us in his letter today is by looking for the things that are in heaven. We must take heed, yet he is not telling us to ignore what is happening around us, far from it, but by concentrating on the risen Christ we find our true humanity. By looking in love upon the one who is truly good and radiant with every grace and virtue we come by this same grace to be renewed, remade, in His likeness.

It is then that we are able to face the demons of internecine interfaith hatred, the oppression of the weak and vulnerable by those who prefer the abuse of power, the refinement of greed to an art-form, and all those other temptations which you will be able to add to the list. Then we can eat and drink together, celebrate the Eucharist, in the remarkable awareness that God through love has beaten down these deadly powers and calls us to take our place at His final victory.

POPE FRANCIS' INTENTION FOR APRIL: Universal: Fundamental rights. For those who risk their lives while fighting for fundamental rights under dictatorships, authoritarian regimes and even in democracies in crisis.

A few words from Father Vincent:

Christ is risen......Alleluia!

We have been blessed to have been able to celebrate, despite many restrictions, the Sacred Triduum and Easter. This time last year we were in total lockdown and Father Ansel, Father Jaya and myself prayed the 'Office of the Church' together instead of celebrating the Triduum. If you remember we said it did not make sense without the community (which is generally true of the Eucharist/the Mass). We did concelebrate on Easter Sunday which was strange without a congregation; but it reminded us that, no matter where everyone was, Christ was there: risen, glorified and present to each person.

We then started streaming with an iPad, which was hit and miss, but very personal (either from my study/lounge and then the church). Once the streaming system was up we have been able to stream daily which, I know, is a blessing for so many.

Slowly we are coming out of lockdown; every 5 weeks another step; this is good news in more ways than one. Whether we will ever be back to full churches as we were in the past we don't know. There are too many variables in terms of social distancing, broken habits, some even still with a fear of enclosed spaces. But nevertheless Christ is risen, Christ is with us, Christ is where we are: in church, at home, in the street, in the 'other' we are with, in the stranger, in the passer -by. That knowledge should encourage us to rejoice; to give thanks; to want to engage more with our faith and the expression of that faith within the community context. That will come if we are patient and if we desire and value it.

Finally thank you to all the volunteers who enable us to function as a Parish both in terms of liturgy (stewards, readers, musicians/singers, decorators etc......) and in terms of support, outreach and the like.

Keep safe! Be safe! Think of others! And remember: if you suspect you have been near someone with coronavirus, or are not feeling well yourself, stay at home and certainly DO NOT mix with others; also refrain from coming to church; think of others!

Thank you for reading this...... I hope! Happy and Blessed Easter. Have a good week.
