CALLED TO BE PROPHETS IN THE HERE AND NOW

The Gospel passage for today is entitled "A prophet is only despised in his own country." Jesus was rejected by those in His home town: He was disbelieved and discredited.

Today we find ourselves surrounded by examples of subtle and overt rejection and I am sure that we have all come into contact with those who do not feel welcomed in the country that have given their new allegiance to: those survivors of Windrush; those who have had to apply for British Citizenship because we no longer recognise our European brothers and sisters; those who wish to apply for the British forces and have been discounted because of their genealogy; those who are discriminated against because of race, ethnicity or creed.

Southampton has become a contact hub for Hate Crimes and it is hard to accept and reconcile ourselves to the fact that people would want to deliberately persecute those they share a city with.

In our Alpha journey this week we were looking at the topic: "How do I resist Evil?" During our discussions we became aware that evil/bad people does/do exist and we need to find ways of combating evil with good and to learn from previous experiences. We were reminded of such atrocities as the holocaust, genocide, world wars and serial killers. (And at this current time we are unravelling more and more of the presence and impact of child abuse). We watched the most incredible testimonies of those whose lives had been transformed by the Alpha journey and in accepting the unconditional love and forgiveness that only Jesus can bring. We also listened to those who have forgiven perpetrators even when their own family members have been tortured and killed.

Being a prophet is not an easy or comfortable existence because we are called to challenge the status quo. By virtue of our Baptism we are all called to be prophets, priests and kings. We all have a responsibility to stand up for what is right and witness to God's Kingdom present in our midst.

Our countries, our land, our inheritance are not our own but God's. Sadly we all have the potential to make our communities unwelcome, discriminating and self-effacing by our own weakness and mortality. St Paul boasts about his weaknesses and it is in recognising our own prejudices and our own shortcomings that we can look toward the God who will enable and make us one. We have a responsibility to proclaim the coming of God's Kingdom here on earth. We have worked hard over the last couple of years on our ministries of welcoming and hospitality. But we still have much to do.

Christianity turns the ordinary standards of the world upside down. When we follow Christ and suffer persecution, insults, and hardships with Him, we are not among the world's losers. We are the prize-winners. Beatitude is ours!

Hardship, insult, persecution, and most especially the wretched sin that besets us these things are not our final state. Beauty and love in life with the Lord are our final state. They are our home. (Eleonore Stump : Professor of Philosophy, Saint Louis University) Tina Quinn
