Called to listen, speak and respond!

In this Sunday's readings we are presented with three interwoven messages which have huge relevance and significance in today's world and current situation:

The prophet Isaiah speaks about deliverance from exile and the need for those who are suffering to be liberated.

The apostle James reminds us of the need to honour the poor and not to judge by appearance.

In the gospel we see the practical working out of Isaiah's prophecy: that it is the Lord who gives sight to the blind and raises up those who are bowed down.

Pope Francis speaks eloquently on these readings:

'Jesus revealed to us the secret of a miracle that we too can imitate, becoming protagonists of "Ephphatha," of that phrase 'be opened' with which he gave speech and hearing back to the deaf and dumb man. It means opening ourselves to the needs of our brothers and sisters who are suffering and in need of help, by shunning selfishness and hardheartedness.

It is precisely the heart, that is, the deep core of the person, that Jesus came to "open," to free, in order to make us capable of fully living the relationship with God and with others. He became man so that man, rendered internally deaf and mute by sin, may hear the voice of God, the voice of Love that speaks to his heart, and thereby in turn, may learn to speak the language of love, transforming it into gestures of generosity and self-giving.' "Be Opened" Angelus September 9th 2018.

During my week in Lourdes I witnessed many practical examples of volunteers serving and supporting the sick and disabled. Lourdes is truly a place where the sick take priority and are given prestige and respect above the able and mobile. Pre-Covid pilgrims would queue to 'take the water' to be immersed in the healing spring reminding them of their Baptism and the healing properties of water.

Now; post Covid pilgrims are invited to perform the gestures asked of Bernadette when The Blessed Virgin appeared to her in the apparitions. Our Lady asked Bernadette to wash her hands, to wash her face and to drink from the muddy spring. It is a practical gesture that opens the heart to that fiat, the Yes of Mary, when she was asked to be the Mother of Our Lord. It did not matter which language each pilgrim could or could not speak or understand. Actions spoke louder than words. As volunteers we were taught to smile and welcome with our eyes.

Jesus did not just use words in the gospel: he touched the ears and the mouth of the dumb and mute. He invited a similar response: an unconditional openness to the will of God in our lives and the lives of others.

What should our response be to our brothers and sisters still struggling with Covid, or the victims of hate crime, or those who have been abandoned by their country by a government takeover?

As I have prayed and pondered over the desperate situation in Afghanistan, today's readings presents us with our response: to listen to the prophet, to allow Jesus to open our ears and our hearts to be able to hear the cries of our Afghan brothers and sisters, to speak for them and welcome them into our country, our families, and our hearts whoever they might be: poor, destitute. This is the language and response of love that Christ modelled for us in today's gospel. We cannot be deaf or mute to this crisis: we need to respond!

Southampton Hate Crime Network Disability Hate Crime Virtual Discussion Thursday 16th September - 11.30am - 1pm Southampton Hate Crime Network will be hosting an online discussion to raise awareness of Disability Hate Crime and issues relevant to Disabled People. The session will involve staff from SPECTRUM Centre for Independent Living, an organisation run and controlled by Disabled People, speaking from their own personal experiences. About the session, on Thursday the 16th of September from 11.30 am - 1pm, is part of the South ampton Hate Crime Network's initiative to better inform the public about different strands of Hate Crime. SPECTRUM, dedi cated to supporting Disabled People in leading independent lives, will be hosting the first of several Hate Crime awareness raising sessions over the next six months. Each session will be led by an organisation that has relevant knowledge on a specific type of Hate Crime; Race, Religion, LGBTQ+ or Disability. GREEN LIVING 'Why should we declare a climate emergency?'

Other faith organisations we support and trust have already declared a climate emergency. The Methodists did in July 2019. The Church of England did in February 2020. Tearfund did in February 2021. Christian Aid did in May 2021. Pope Francis was ahead of the game by writing 'Laudato Si', a letter to the entire Roman Catholic church warning of the climate crisis, in May 2015, and the Quakers even further back, in 2011. Let's join in with our ecumenical partners.

We are already planning with Avenue St Andrew's (URC Church across the Avenue) a pulpit swap for Climate Sunday, a joint display outside the church buildings of how seriously we take the climate change emergency, and a joint litter pick in our local area. Please continue to watch this weekly update.
