GETTING CLOSER TO JOB

When we arrive for Mass in church or at our screens on Sunday morning, we usually expect to hear something uplifting, hopeful and inspiring to help us through the week. But this Sunday it is different or at first it is different. The first reading from Job is not meant to fill us with hope, but to give voice to the longings we find inside ourselves. We long for a life free from suffering. We long for rest from our work. We look for the day when we will have hope, true hope, that finally crushes those inner doubts.

Here, Job asks the question that scripture seeks to answer. Essentially, he is saying, "My life is painful, hard, sad, and swiftly ends—is this all there is? Is it really meaningless?" We are invited to think, to pray, to join our voices with Job, asking God and to question. Giving voice to such doubts is not a comfortable experience, though.

Grief consumes Job's life, it eats up his hope, it chases away his dreams. On the one hand, his nights drag on with endless, sorrow-filled wakefulness, whilst his days fly swiftly away. Job compares his life to a mere breath, or in his original Hebrew ruach. In the Hebrew Bible the soul, the life and breath itself are connected—as when God breathes the breath or ruach of life into Adam's nostrils. It was the ruach elohim that hovered over the waters at the creation.

And yet still this reading from Job may not leave us satisfied. But perhaps it is not intended to, perhaps it is meant to stoke the fires of longing in our hearts - seeking answers, meaning, rest, hope. Spending time with Job checks any desire for superficiality in our faith. Notwithstanding that Job lived several millennia ago we may find the same complaints, questions and anguish voiced by our friends, our families, even our own hearts.

Lent is 10 days away, a time to dig deep so as to know not only ourselves but the Christ who has redeemed us. Lent is a time to engage in those things we might not always allow ourselves. How about joining one of the Lent Retreats, or reading 'Holy Week Voices of the Holy Land' available from the Friends of the Holy Land; all mentioned in this newsletter. I am. It is through questioning ourselves that we can answer the questions of others.

A few words from Father Vincent

Hello and welcome to February! Where has the time gone? In ten days' time we begin Lent (Ash Wednesday: 17th February). Last year Lent began as 'normal' but ended in lockdown which then took us through a strange, almost a 'non' Holy Week and 'not normal' Eastertime!

The question I, the clergy and various teams in the parish, have been asking is, how do we mark Lent this year? What do we do on Ash Wednesday? How can we make the most of Lent? One thing we are certain of, it will not be 'normal service' by any stretch of the imagination!

Maybe this Lent could be more reflective at both a personal and parish level:

- schedule time for personal/family prayer;
- use a meditation booklet/or online meditations on a daily/weekly basis;
- o participate in one of the retreats advertised in this newsletter; be determined to engage with Mass online as often as we can, especially on Sundays (there is no excuse even if we cannot due to restrictions actually be at Mass; and we can be nourished in a real way through the Scripture, the homily (fingers crossed!) and the prayers;
- oduring 'exercise time' out and about use nature to pray (look/be alert/notice nature, people); begin and end the day acknowledging the presence of the Lord (if you don't already): it can simply be 'hello Lord' 'thank you Lord' the important thing is to mark the day and allow the Lord to journey with you.
- o join the online Stations of the Cross or time for meditation/reflection we plan to organise

We begin with Ash Wednesday (17th Feb) with 3 Masses: so book via Eventbrite or participate online. If online why not make some ash for yourselves (hasn't got to be from a palm but if you have one then great it can be ash from anything); when the priest puts ash on the heads of those at Mass (sprinkling on the head; wearing gloves and mask; no words!) do the same at home (but you can do it on the forehead as usual!)! Don't be embarrassed! Improvise! You/your family are the 'Domestic Church' so live it out!

Keep an eye on the website for liturgies and the like to 'make the most of Lent'

Keep safe! Be safe! Think of others! And remember: if you suspect you have been near someone with coronavirus, or are not feeling well yourself, stay at home and certainly DO NOT mix with others; also refrain from coming to church; think of others!
